Guidelines for Seminar Papers and Theses

Institute of Economic History Humboldt-University Berlin

(1) Formal Requirements

Your paper has to include:

- cover page
- list of contents (and list of tables, list of graphs, list of abbreviations etc.)
- text body with introduction, main part and conclusion
- list of references
- appendix (for detailed data description, additional tables etc.)

For the text lay-out use:

- page margins of 2.5 cm (ca. 1")
- double line spacing
- regular font, such as Times New Roman, Arial, Verdana, Calibri, Tahoma
- font size of 11 or 12 pt.
- page numbers (first page of text is page 1, for previous pages use roman numbering I, II etc., cover page does not count)

Your cover page has to include:

- title
- name of student and matriculation number
- date of submission
- course title
- name of professor/lectures
- name of institute, faculty and university

Your list of contents has to include:

- all sections and sub-sections
- no single sub-sections (2.1 only if 2.2 exists)
- short, meaningful, and precise section and sub-section titles

Your list of references has to include:

- all and only works referenced in your paper
- list references alphabetically

Your citation style has to be strictly IN-TEXT:

- as a guideline use this <u>article</u> by Prof. Wolf in the Journal of Economic Geography
- see also the links to in-text citation guides on our website

Usage of footnotes:

- reference footnotes only at the end of a sentence
- keep footnotes at a minimum: use only for further information, translations, or explanations that are not essential for understanding of the main text
- always use footnotes and not endnotes

Usage of quotations (i.e. a direct quote with "..."):

- keep quotations at a minimum: use only when the wording is unique, striking, figurative
- distinguish between short (< three lines) and long quotation (≥ three lines), so-called "block quotation" which are distinct and indented from main text

Usage of tables, equations, definitions, etc.:

number tables, graphs etc. according to chapters (e.g. "table 2.2" for the second table in section 2, "definition 3.2" for the second definition in section 3.)
