- Berlin's oldest university
- In 1810, Wilhelm von Humboldt's vision for a new type of university became reality
- His vision:
 - to uphold the ideal of research without restrictions
 - to provide an all-round education
 - the unity of research and teaching
- → Humboldt created a new type of university that soon became popular all over Germany



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
